


Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Raycom Media, Inc. ("Raycom") and HITV License Subsidiary, Inc. ("HITV"), we are writing in connection with the March 29, 2010 letter from the Chief, Video Division of the Media Bureau ("Bureau Letter Ruling") that granted in part and denied in part a Freedom of Information Act request for inspection of records filed by Rick Daysog/Honolulu Advertiser on December 9, 2009 and a Request For Confidential Treatment filed by Raycom and HITV on November 9, 2009.

The Bureau Letter Ruling states that Raycom and HITV have an opportunity, within 10 business days, to file an application for review with the Commission's General Counsel in accordance with Section 0.461(i) of the Commission's rules.
